Annual Act of Commemoration at Runnymede



On Sunday 18th May 2025 at 11 am. Paul gathered alongside serving and veteran members of the RAF to honour 20,263 members of the Commonwealth Air Forces who lost their lives in the Second World War 1939/45 while operating from the United Kingdom and Northwest Europe and who have no known grave. The service was attended by Chief of the Air Staff, Sir Richard John Knighton, and conducted by Air Vice-Marshal Giles Leslie Legood, Chaplain-in-Chief of the RAF.

RAFA Caduceus was honoured to be one of three branches to have their Standard chosen to be paraded at this prestigious occasion. Wreaths were laid on behalf of the Commonwealth Air Forces and Ex Service organisations, including the RAF Association.

The Branch decided not to lay a wreath on this occasion, but I was persuaded to do some moonlighting and laid a wreath on behalf of our fellow Virtual Branch, the Armourers.

This moving ceremony is open to all who wish to pay their respects to those named on the memorial, and the branch will be promoting the event again next year.
